

Walking in the Chilterns

The HS2 railway goes through the Chilterns National Landscape and will have several routes available with bridges for walkers and cyclists to safely cross the line once the construction has finished.

Meanwhile many Public Rights of Way are disrupted, and users may encounter issues when a suggested diversion is either not indicated or also closed. With the evolving state of the paths HS2 have now created an online mapping system showing all the current closures.

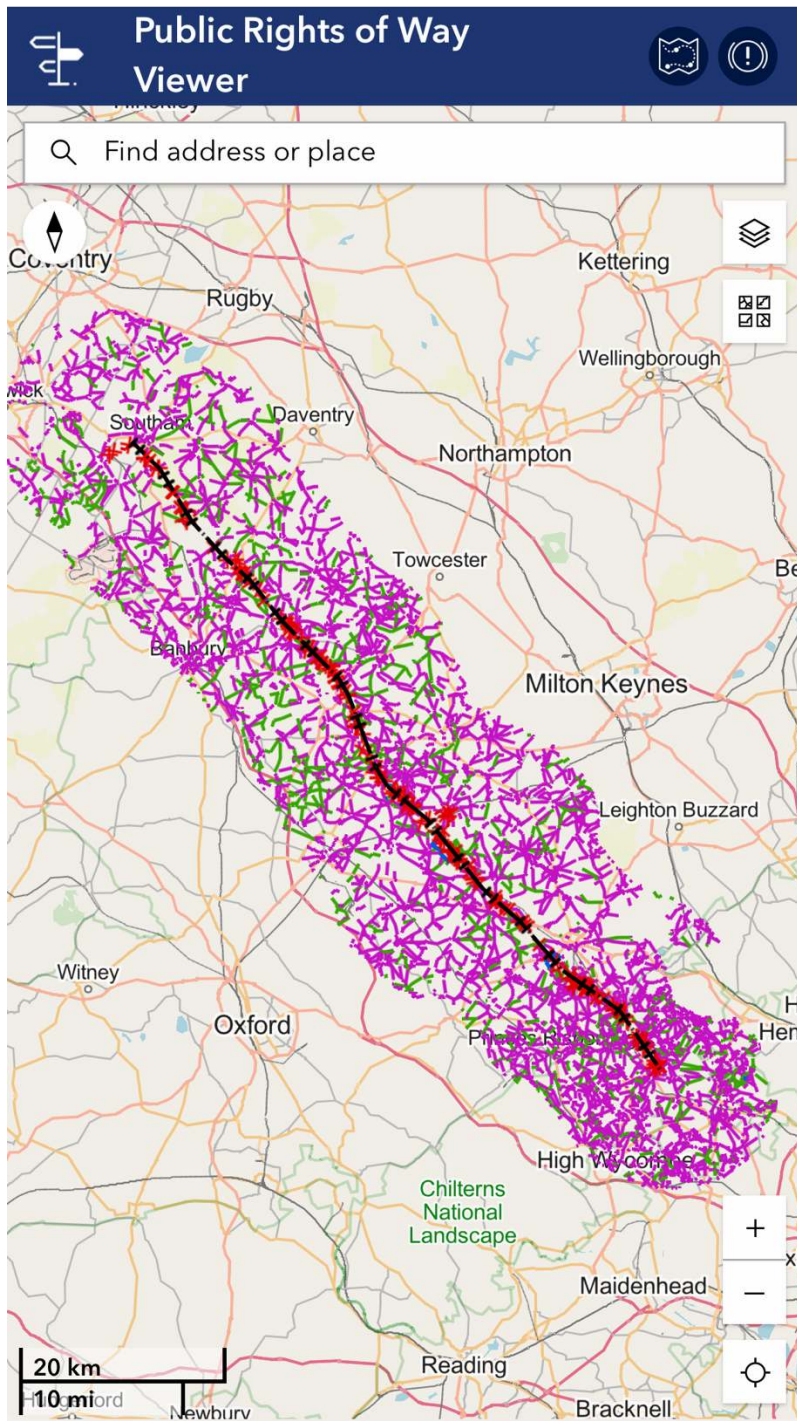
The website is available at <https://tinyurl.com/HS2PRoWmap> which can be accessed from a laptop and also reached using this QR code with a smartphone.

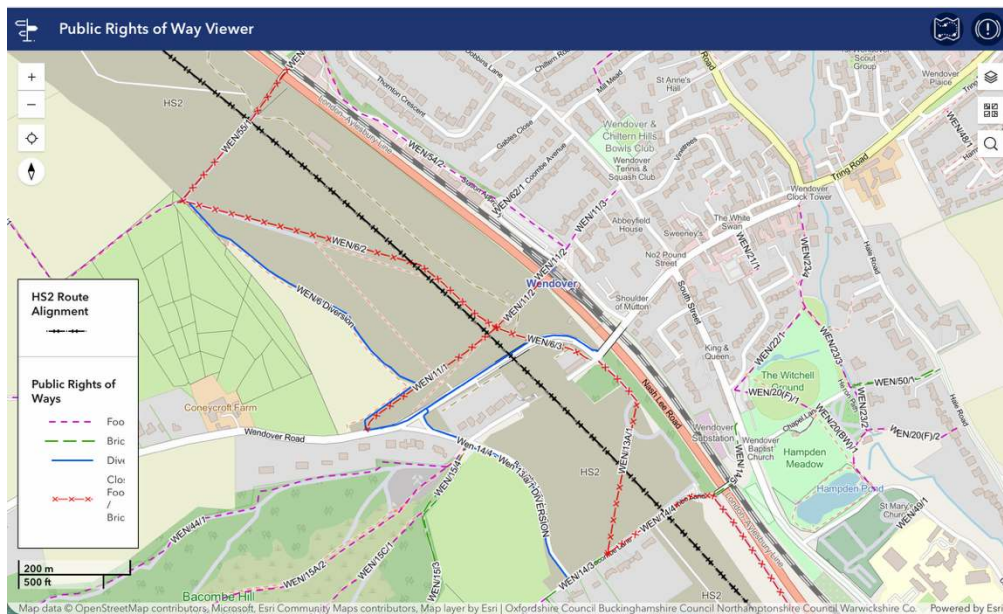


The QR code is also displayed on all the EKFB PRow diversion signs to give up to date closure information.

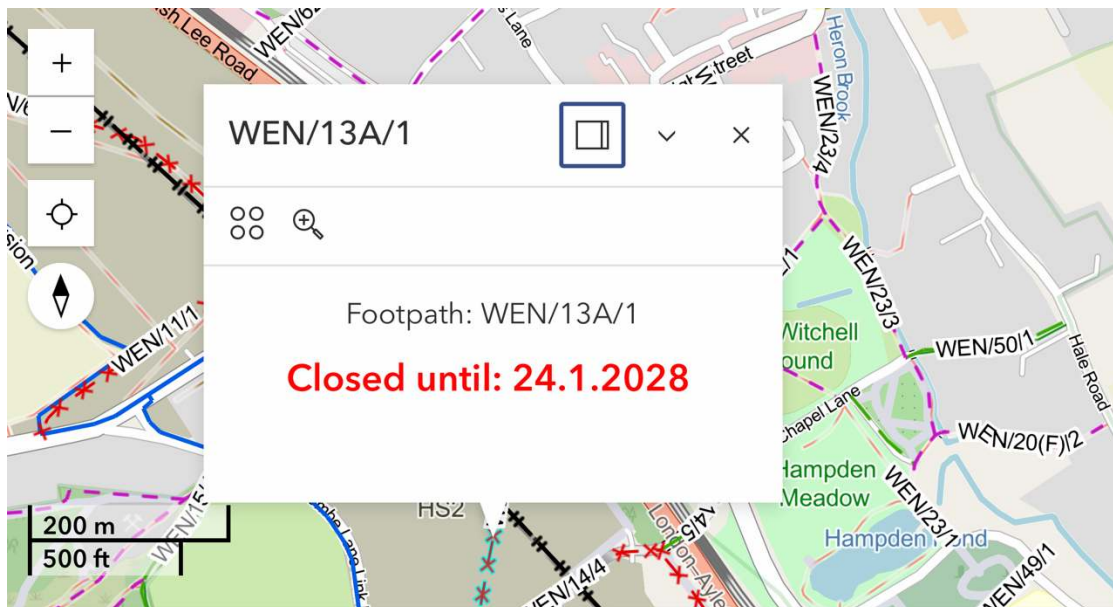


The website presents a map showing the long distance paths (such as the Ridgeway and Aylesbury Ring) along with the closures and diversions between Wendover Dean and Brackley.

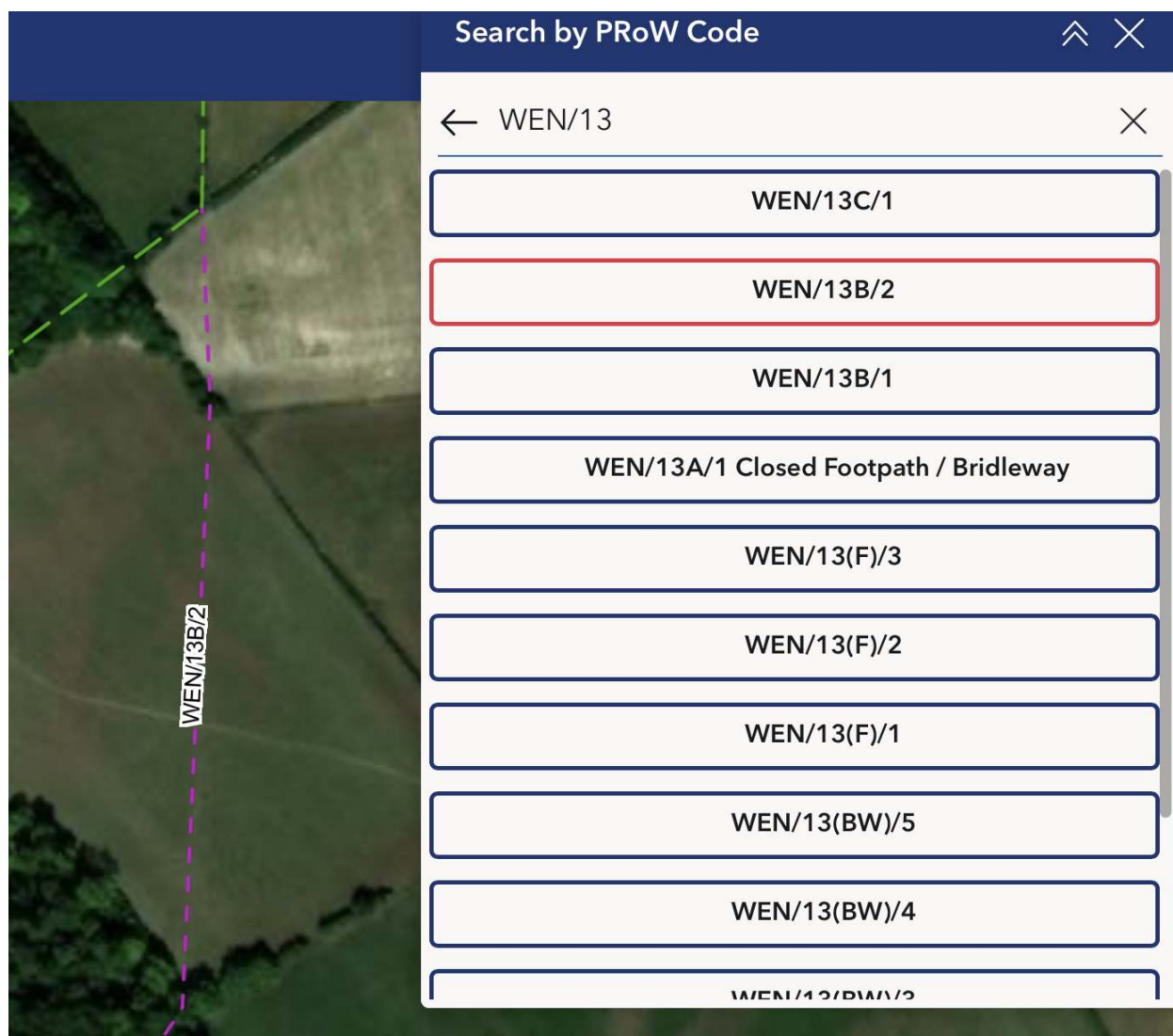




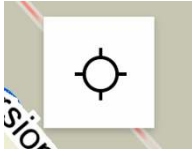
You can zoom in and click on a path to get specific details



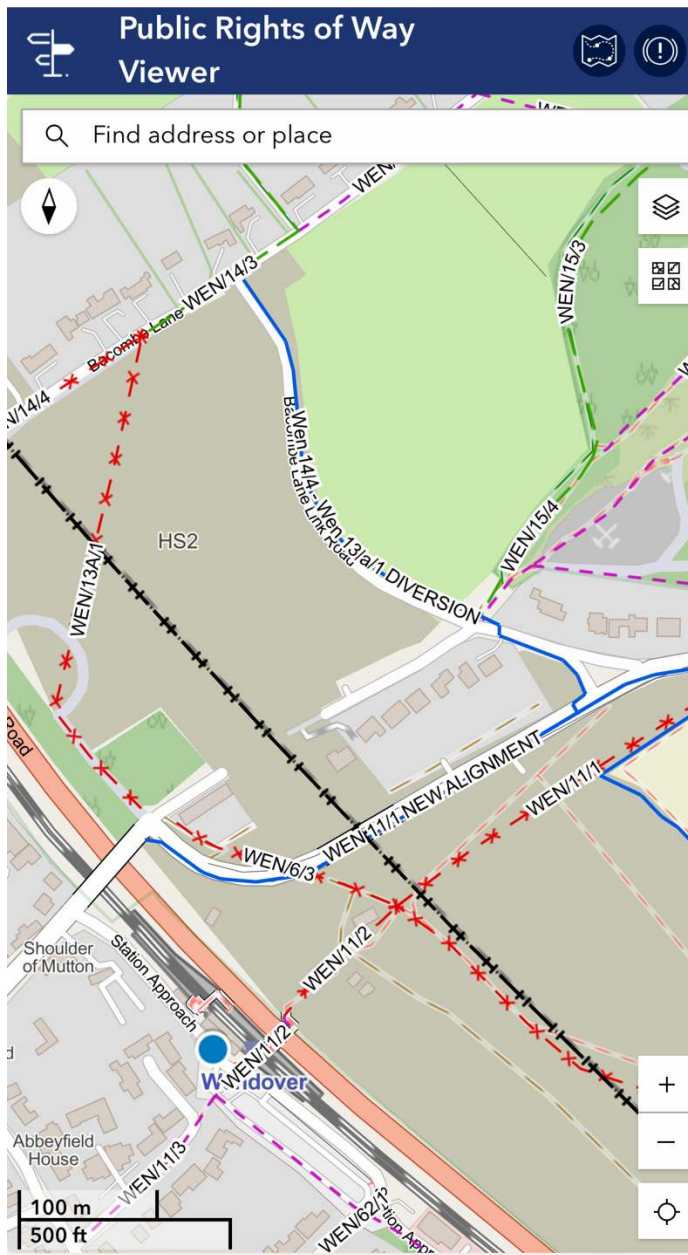
If you know the PRow code for a path you're interested in, you can search for the code; then select the section one you want and the system will zoom in to the right location



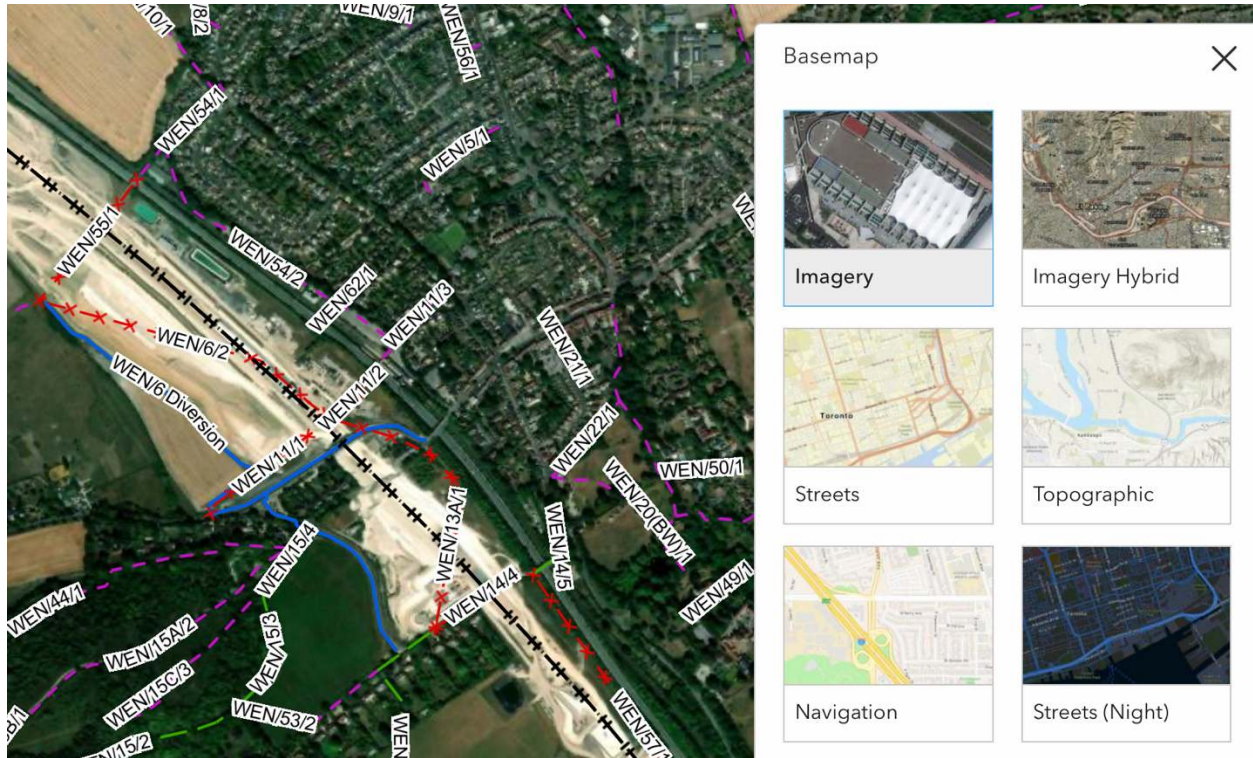
Another useful function for walkers is the ability to show where you are by pressing the location button.



This then overlays a blue dot on the map showing you current position (eg Wendover Station).



You can also change the “base map” to a range of different styles, including satellite images, topographic and cartographic map types.
